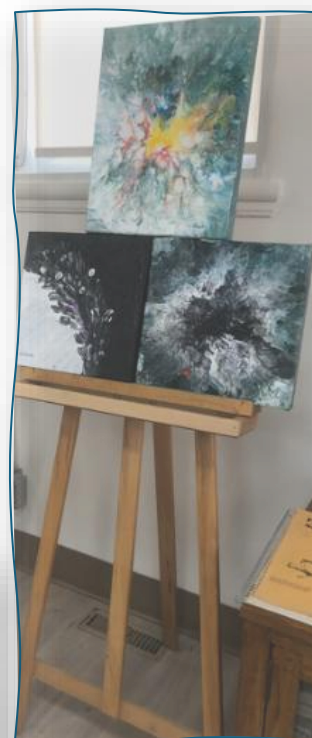

SMART PADLOCK

To better secure our infrastructure, the northern boat launch (10 Lapierre St.), southern boat launch, and southern parking (300 Millette Rd.) will now be secured with a smart padlock:

Access is simple and practical, if you:

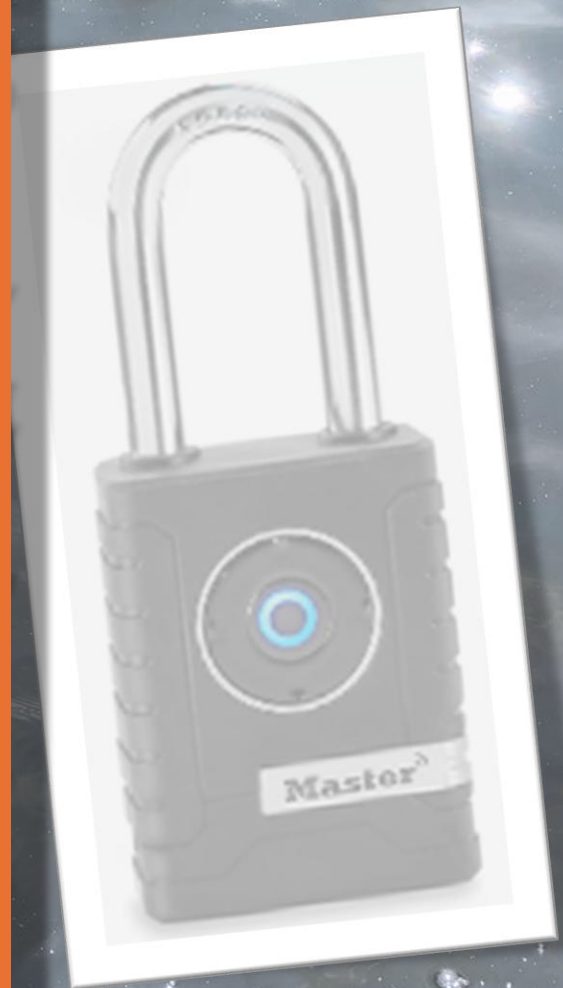
- *Have a valid sticker for your boat issued by the Municipality*

Important reminder – Garbage recycles compost area at the village

The fence around this area will always remain closed. It is secured by an intelligent padlock, which means you will need your access code. You can request one by completing the form available on our website.

Each user has a unique code, so if you want a family member or friend to drop off your waste, they will also need to have the application with their own code. An attendant will be on hand from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. every weekend throughout the summer to assist you. We thank you for your cooperation in ensuring the safety and smooth operation of these areas.

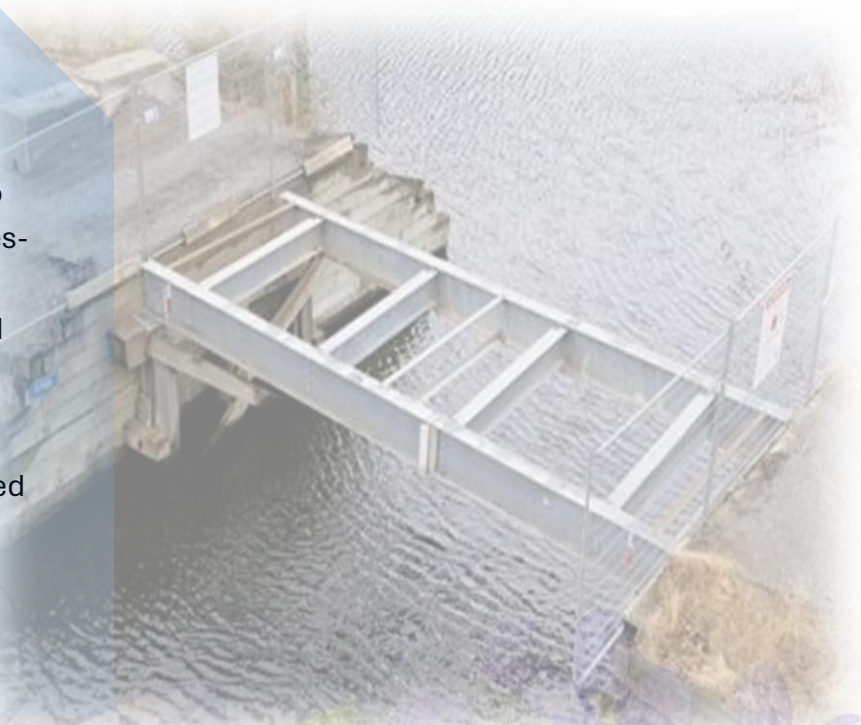

Newaygo Bridge

Due to a citizens' injunction, the Newaygo Bridge, which links Morin-Heights, Lac-des-Seize-Îles and as far as Amherst on the aerobic corridor at Monfort, will be closed again this summer.

The temporary footbridge planned by the MRC for this summer will not be completed until autumn.

We will keep you posted on further developments.





Lyme disease

Expansion of the risk zone in the Laurentians

The Direction of **santé publique des Laurentides** informs us that the high-risk zone for Lyme disease now extends further north in the region, including nearly fifty municipalities. With the arrival of summer, it's essential to be extra cautious during outdoor activities.

What to do in the event of a tick bite?

Remove the tick as quickly as possible, ideally within **24 hours**, using a tick remover or **fine forceps (avoid fingers)**.

- Consult **Info-Santé (811)** or a physician if:
- A redness of more than 5 cm appears around the bite.
- It persists for **more than 48 hours**
- You develop unusual symptoms in the following days/weeks.

Preventive treatment possible

If the bite occurred in one of the at-risk municipalities, **a preventive dose of antibiotics may be prescribed** after evaluation by a doctor or pharmacist.

Prevent bites: the right reflexes



- Stay on trails and avoid tall grass.
- Use mosquito repellent containing **DEET or icaridine**.
- Wear long, light-colored, close-fitting clothing.
- Carefully examine your body when you get home (**shower or bath recommended**)

These gestures also protect against other mosquito-borne infections.
